

# Neonatal Follow-up Clinic (NFUC)

is a clinic where a team of specially trained health care professionals provide detailed developmental assessments.

## Premature babies\* should be seen by a neonatal follow-up clinic. Here's why:

\*Ask your hospital whether Follow-Up is recommended for your child.

The clinic team will check your baby's growth and development, identify strengths and possible challenges so that early interventions can begin, if needed.

### What should I expect at the clinic appointment?

The clinic team will:

- get to know your baby
- complete a detailed growth and development assessment
- explain your baby's progress
- offer activities to support ongoing development
- refer you to community resources (therapists, other medical specialists) if needed
- share details of the assessment with your baby's doctor

Most clinics have a multidisciplinary team who provide assessments for the **first 2 years or longer** post-discharge from the NICU\*.

Depending on your baby's corrected age\*\*, your assessment may include:



Feeding & Growth



Motor Skills (Muscles)



Language & Communication



Thinking & Problem Solving



Hearing



Vision



Caregivers' Mental Health

### Getting ready for your appointment:

The clinic team will be ready to answer any questions you may have, so this is a great time to ask! It is helpful to write your questions down to bring with you.

### A note on corrected age\*\*:

Your premature baby's development in the first 2-3 years is based on **their corrected age using YOUR due date** - not the date they were born.

### Important to know

The follow-up clinic does not replace your baby's doctor. Appointments and assessments vary by hospital, province and territories. Your visit will take longer than a usual doctors' appointment. If your baby has a cold or is sick, please call the clinic before coming.
